
Culturally Relevant Education

Ladson-Billings (2014) concluded three major domains of the successful teachers work:

- *1. Academic Success* or the intellect students gain as a result of classroom instruction and learning
- 2. Cultural Competence or the ability to help students appreciate and celebrate their cultures of origin while gaining knowledge of and fluency in at least one other culture
- 3. Sociopolitical Consciousness or the ability to take learning beyond the confines of the classroom using school knowledge and and skills to identify, analyze, and solve real-world problems (p.75)
